

THERE BUT NOT THERE

Remembered is a new charity which was founded after the enormous impact that the installation of the, **THERE BUT NOT THERE** silhouettes, in Penshurst Church in Kent, had over the Remembrance period of 2016. The silhouettes were designed by the conceptual photographic artist Martin Barraud (pictured above).

The Armed Forces Covenant Fund

provided a grant to St John the Evangelist Caterham Valley, for the installation of 20 of these silhouettes to commemorate the Centenary of the Armistice.

During WWI St John's lost 56 members of our congregation. Each silhouette represents 2 or 3 members of the Church who died during the conflict of WWI. The names of the fallen are displayed in front of each silhouette. The silhouettes are a visual reminder to us of the huge gap they left in a small community. *Remembered* has three simple but significant aims:

To **Commemorate** the Fallen through highlighting the sacrifices made. The 2018 Armistice Project, **THERE BUT NOT THERE**, will be the Centenary Commemoration of the Armistice.

To **Educate** all generations, particularly today's younger generation, born nearly 100 years after the outbreak of WWI, to understand what led to the loss of **888,246** British and Commonwealth Service Personnel.

To help **Heal** those suffering from the hidden wounds of post-traumatic stress disorder and other lasting legacies of combat, by raising funds for our beneficiary charities. Today, the mental health taboo of Post Traumatic Stress, or 'shell shock' as it was known in the Great War, is being broken and *Remembered* aims to play a significant role in helping build better futures for veterans and those suffering from mental illness.

Remembered is a Registered Charity and a Charitable Incorporated Organisation.

The Silhouettes will be on display in St John's Church until Sunday 18th November.
